

Welcome to the 7th-8th Grade Summer Reading Program! We know that reading is a vital skill, and for every child it requires constant practice to maintain and improve ability. We have seen consistent positive results from students who keep reading over the summer.

The program is relatively simple. A student must read one book from at least three of five different categories or genres from the attached 7th – 8th grade list and respond to the book. This response can take the form of a book recommendation, a letter to a friend about the book, a 3-D project or a comic strip. Encourage your student to have fun and be creative. Book responses should show what the book was about and what your student thought about the book. Each student only needs to read a total of three books, but they are encouraged to read more. It's easy! Almost all listed books can be found in our library or on the classroom bookshelves. Also, because there are a great many new books published each year we are always open to parental suggestions. Make reading a family adventure and a priority. Have your child read aloud to you. Read a book together. Have a set time of the day when everyone sits down and reads. The more you can encourage your child to read, the better they will become at reading which will affect how well they do in school and life.

Those students who fail to complete their summer reading will be required to attend a Tuesday afternoon reading room until they have turned in three reading responses. Reading responses are due the first day of school.
