Dear Friends,

In my 45 years in the ministry of the New Church it has seemed to me that one of the most difficult things we can ask people to do is share their faith. We have *so much* to share we find it hard even to know where to start. And we're afraid of messing up, or of alienating people who might not appreciate what we say. Plus, for some, religion is a very personal thing, and no one wants to impose or get caught up in unfavorable comparisons with others' views.

Unfortunately, since word-of-mouth is by far the most effective form of advertising, our reluctance to do it has had a negative effect on our ability to grow as a congregation of the church.

Of course, it goes without saying that most people are not ready for the New Church. There are even indications in the Writings that as few as 5% of the population at any given time may be truly, deeply interested in spiritual things. Still, that is no reason to be discouraged. There are over 6 million people in the DC metropolitan area and 5% of that is over 300,000. Just imagine if even 1% of those people could see the value of the New Church teachings: that would be 3,000. And if just 1% of those people were to join us our congregation would grow by 30%. As someone said years ago, in outreach we are dealing in the laws of large numbers.

Practice Makes Perfect

I remember when I first starting sharing my NC faith with others; I said some dumb things, and in retrospect made some pretty silly mistakes. But the important thing is that I learned from those mistakes and was able to do a little better each time until I developed a fairly "standard" way of answering questions. I still don't like sharing these important concepts with people who are just making conversation, but quite often I find that a casual question *can* lead to a really meaningful conversation – and a lot of positive interest.

So with this by way of background I want to invite ALL of you to come on out and practice *with me* at this year's **Bowie-Fest, at Al-len Pond Park on Saturday, June 2nd**, anytime from 8 AM until closing time around 5 PM. We'll have pamphlets and other literature, trinkets and even bottled water to hand out to people walking past our booth, and really, all you have to do is smile a lot and engage with people so they know you care. If someone asks you a question you can't answer, one of the ministers will be there to

back you up – but really, if you just tell people why the NC is important to YOU, you've done your job!

Of course we'll be promoting the school as well as the church, but we'll have literature for both, and we know from previous years' experience that we will meet a lot of very nice and interesting people. We will also get an opportunity to see how other churches present *themselves*, and so learn what other people in our community think is important in a church.

Please give your serious consideration to helping with this. Even a one hour stint would be great, and the more volunteers we have the more fun it will be. Contact Mike, Michael or Bonnie to sign up!

Communication! In Heaven & Hell we read,

"How great is the wisdom of angels can be confirmed from the fact that in the heavens there is a communication of all things. Intelligence and wisdom are communicated from one to another, and heaven is a communion of all goods. The reason is that heavenly love is such that it wills what is its own to be another's. *Consequently, no one in heaven perceives his own good in himself to be good unless it is also in another; and this is the source of the happiness of heaven.*" (#268)

"It is the delight of everyone in heaven to share his delights and blessings with others." (#399)

And in the Arcana we are taught,

"The angelic state is such that everyone communicates his own blessedness and happiness to others, for in the next life all affections and thoughts are communicated and perceived faultlessly. *Each individual therefore communicates his own joy to all others, and so do all to each individual.* Consequently each individual is so to speak the focal point of all. This is the heavenly form. The more there are to constitute the Lord's kingdom therefore, the greater the happiness, for this grows in proportion to the increase in numbers. This is why heavenly happiness is indescribable." (#549)

To think that we, like angels, could communicate "faultlessly" is of course a stretch. But again, we'll never learn if we don't practice. So let's practice. Our spiritual lives may depend on it.

There are people who have security cameras in their driveways. Others aim them on their babies at night, so they can check in. When I was a chicken keeper I considered setting one up to discover what was hunting my birds. But not many people turn on the video when they argue. Living though it once is more than enough. Still it can be entertaining, illuminating in a macabre way, to watch someone else quarrel. There is a Monty Python sketch where someone pays for the privilege of conflict. Their ping pong of dialogue is funny, but only because it is not us. When I am on one side of the dispute, it is not amusing. It is maddening.

Watching what such hammering actually looks like is one step toward choosing differently. There are more productive ways to engage with the people we share this life with.

Being able to cleanly articulate what someone else believes is one strategy to short circuit the bickering. Speak in a way that lets them feel understood. Put your own position on hold, like a blouse on the clearance rack that you can come back for later if you still want it. Ask the person you love if you got it right, and be willing to keep trying. In my experience that effort alone opens the door between me and my debating partner, or at least renders it transparent. Then sometimes I find that I am less inclined to go back for my old opinion anyway. It doesn't fit so well anymore.
