From the Pastor: Get Ready for New Church Day!

Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands.

Serve the Lord with gladness: come before His presence with singing.

Know ye that the Lord He is God: it is He that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture.

Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him, and bless His name. For the Lord is good; His mercy is everlasting; and His truth endureth to all generations. (*Psalms* 100)

Last June we were still in the early days of the pandemic. Sunday worship was still an online-only event, which meant that our celebration of New Church Day (June 19th) was decidedly light in the festivities department. Now, a year has gone by, and we are still operating under COVID restrictions, but those restrictions are less severe than they once were. What's more, there has so far, recently, been a good trend in the various measures of our worldwide fight against the novel coronavirus. Infection rates are down, immunization is moving along, and as I write this the State of Maryland is approaching the vaccination percentage threshold that will trigger an official change in our mask-wearing policies, among other things.

In light of these trends, while recognizing the essential unknowability of the future, I have been talking with trustees, pastor's council members, and other individuals in the church, and looking to what neighboring churches as well as other General Church societies are doing and have begun to make plans for a couple of things. First of all, I am planning for an outdoor celebration of New Church Day to follow the indoor worship service on June 20th. The specifics of how it will work are still a little fluid and will be determined by how pandemic conditions continue to evolve over the next three weeks, so watch for email announcements with more details. But the general plan as it stands right now will be to have a picnic/barbecue along with outdoor activities (volleyball, perhaps).

What's more, I am tentatively looking to that day (June 20th) as the day we reintroduce congregational singing as part of our wor-

ship ritual. Music is a vital part of how we express reverence for and gratitude to the Lord. I am deeply grateful to the musicians who have provided us music as part of our worship experience over the past fifteen months of this plague. But worship is also meant to be something we all contribute to, not just

witness. And so, I have been eagerly looking forward to when we can responsibly reintroduce singing for the entire congregation.

But as I said, this is tentative, and will depend on the ongoing evolution of the whole situation. What's more, anyone who is in a high-risk condition (immunocompromised, not yet vaccinated, etc.) is encouraged to continue to use prudence when it comes to attending church events. We will continue to live stream our indoor worship services, so if June 20th is too soon for you to attend events like this in person, you will still have other means of participating.

It is my hope that we can continue to take steps to return to "normal", full operations as a church community. It has certainly been a long ride so far. But as eager as I am to do so, I am also not going to force things that go against prudence and the ongoing changing circumstances we find ourselves in. We will get there eventually, sooner or later. But I'm praying for sooner, as I imagine you are as well.

New Mask Policy

Starting Friday, May 28th we are adjusting our policy regarding mask wearing. Recently,

the CDC updated its guidance on COVID-19 safety protocols for the United States. Following that, the State of Maryland updated official regulations along somewhat similar lines. And just this last Wednesday, Prince George's County announced that they, too, would be relaxing some restrictions starting later today. At the Washington New Church, we have looked to these three sources, with PG County being our primary source, when developing our own policies regarding health and safety at the church during this pandemic. And so, we are adjusting our policy.

<u>What's changing:</u> If you are vaccinated, you are no longer asked to wear a mask when inside the church, during church (not school) related events. Will anyone be "policing" non-masked people to check on vaccination status? No. I am trusting each person here to use common sense along with a spirit of charity and wisdom to do what is safest for themselves and for the people they come into contact with. In addition, we are no longer requiring social distancing during church events. But see below for more details on this...

<u>What's not changing yet:</u> During school hours and events, everyone inside the building must continue to follow the mask policy as it has existed for many months, now. (i.e., everyone must wear a mask). Again, this is in line with current PG County regulations, in this case as they particularly apply to schools. Also, for the time being, we are still asking that all people practice "social distancing" when gathered in the sanctuary for worship. Accordingly, about half of the seating in the sanctuary will remain closed.

<u>What won't change:</u> Church services will of course continue to be offered online as well as in person. **Online church as an offering of the Washington New Church is here to stay.** That will not go away as an option, even after the pandemic is gone.

<u>What might change soon:</u> For now, we will still be worshipping with only performed (not congregationally sung) music. However,

unless the local status of the pandemic takes a severe turn for the worse, we will reintroduce **congregational singing** as a part of our worship practice on **Sunday**, **June 20th**.

With these changes, **I** am asking everyone to take into consideration the concerns and needs of your neighbors. You may be ready to roar back into "normal" life, but there may be those around you who are taking a more cautious approach to re-entry, for a variety of reasons. This is why, for instance, we are keeping half of the pews closed for now, and why we are going slow with reintroducing singing, and also why we will be holding this year's annual society meeting online via Zoom. Also, if someone chooses to wear a mask when not strictly required to, I fully support that decision and expect that you will be open-minded about it as well.

Pandemics stink. But they are also great opportunities to practice love for our neighbors! I look forward to seeing the lower half of your faces soon! ~ Rev. Mac Frazier

Dear Friends Across the New Church,

The purpose of this letter is to invite you to be part of a centralized project/goal of reading all of the Writings from start to finish.

The way it works is simple. You sign up for the project, and just before June 19 of this year you receive an email which signals you to start reading *Secrets of Heaven*, vol. 1—whichever translation you wish. You read 3 pages a day (possibly more, depending on which translation you're using), and you receive weekly/occasional e-mail updates telling you where you should be in your reading. 4,710 days later you're finished (= 12 years, 10 months, and 23 days)!

This is a project that was recently completed by a group from the United States and South Africa. The group started on June 19, 2008 and finished on May 12, 2021. That group is now circling back and starting again and issuing this church-wide invitation to join.

People who join this effort are free to start or stop at any time. They can also drop in and out along the way. There's no obligation on anyone's part. People who wish to toss ideas, thoughts, or reflections into the mix via email are welcome to do so. But basically, this is an opportunity for people to read individually through all of the Writings (in chronological order) with weekly reminders as a support to personal discipline.

If you are interested in being a part of this project & goal, simply e-mail the Rev. Mark Pendleton and let him know. He will add your name an e-mail address to an e-mail distribution list, and then contact you closer to June 19th with final instructions.
